CADET

The Cadets matched their highest scoring output of the season, putting 13 points up on the board in Saturday's 31-13 loss to the Outlaws. The loss in the semi-final of the D2 playoffs ends the season for the Cadets. JR PEE WEE

The playoff atmosphere at Pinnacle was electric, and the Jr. Pee Wee team gave the crowd what they came for, a solid performance and an 18-6 win over the Pride in the semi-finals of the D2 Championships. The top seeded Storm take on the Bobcats at home in Saturday's rematch for the D2 Championship.

PEE WEE

The Storm Pee Wee's showed why they were finalists last year, hitting the road and taking down the Firebirds, a team that had thoroughly beaten them the week before in front of the Storm home crowd. The Storm, one of only 3 D1 teams (out of 32) to win on the road excelled in all aspects of the game, passing and running with relative ease, and capping off the win with a Will Sevchik extra point late in the 4th quarter.

IR MIDGET

The Jr. Midget team went down fighting in the D1 playoffs, falling to the #3 Aztecs 24-8. The defense was dominant after a shaky start, beginning with a goal line stand to end the first half. The Storm made a game of it, scoring on the opening kickoff to pull within 16 points. The defense didn't let up another point, but the sputtering offense couldn't make up any ground. The record of 3-6 doesn't reflect the effort or growth this team experienced this season.
